This freedom that we enjoy is being gradually taken away from us. This freedom was divinely inspired and given to our founding fathers and is revealed within the Declaration of Independence and our Constitution. It is both a freedom from certain things, like the government dictating what its citizens can and cannot think, do and worship as well as a freedom to do certain things such as the pursuit of life, liberty and happiness.

All of the articles within our Constitution have a strong Biblical base as their foundation and were understood by the founders that it was not a freedom to do “anything” such as sexual perversion; taking advantage of the less fortunate; murder of the innocent (abortion); to name just a few of the practices that are commonly accepted today.

As we as a nation are departing from both the Constitution and the foundation of it (the Word of God and the God of the Word) many are pursuing their own idea of what freedom is. The Word of God makes this very clear in a number of places in both written and illustrated truth. In Eph 5:6 we read, “Let no man deceive you with vain words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience.” What are the vain words to which people are deceived? They are: Eph 5:3-5 “But fornication, and all uncleanness, or covetousness, let it not be once named among you, as becomes saints; neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor jesting, which are not convenient: but rather giving of thanks. For this ye know, that no whoremonger, nor unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, hath any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God.”

God knows and warns us that the afore mentioned practices are not marks of freedom but bondage which leads to death. In Romans 6:16-23, “Do you not know that to

whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin leading to death, or of obedience leading to righteousness? But God be thanked that though you were slaves of sin, yet you obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine to which you were delivered. And having been set free from sin, you became slaves of righteousness.... For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. What fruit did you have then in the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. But now having been set free from sin, and having become slaves of God, you have your fruit to holiness, and the end, everlasting life. For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.”

True freedom is not sinning at will rather not sinning and living for the glory of God.

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
